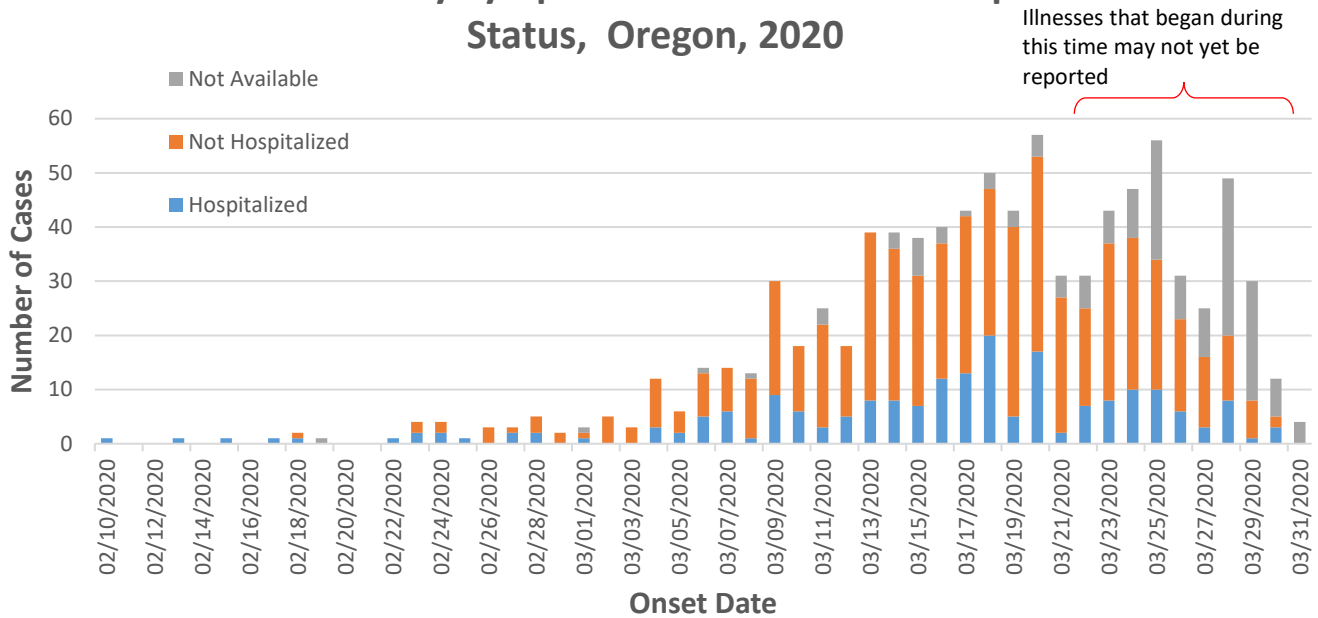


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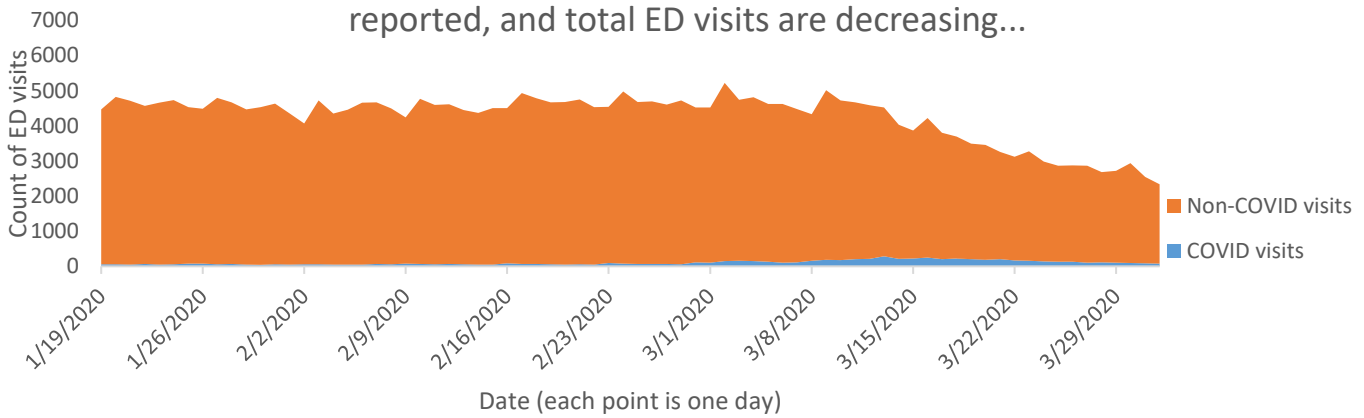
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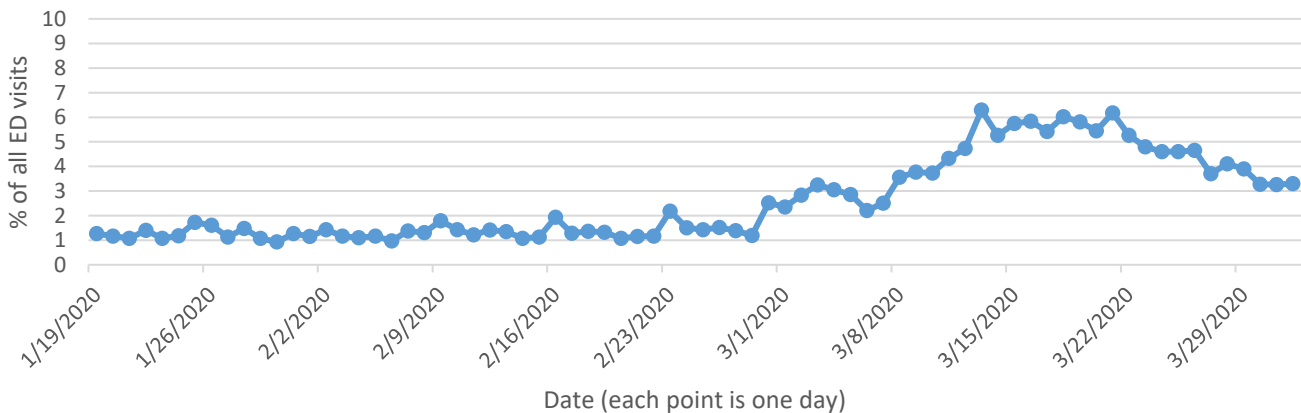
COVID-19 Cases by Symptom Onset Date and Hospitalization Status, Oregon, 2020

We have developed guidance on how DEQ will respond to oil and hazardous material spills during COVID-19 while protecting response personnel. • DEQ - Providing PIO personnel to help staff the ECC JIC. DEQ is also providing OHA with a part-time Deputy Planning Section Chief. • OSFM - is in regular communications with all 13 Regional HazMat Emergency Response Teams.
 <p>ESF 12 Energy</p>	Stable	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Oregon Department of Energy (ODOE) continues to monitor impacts to the fuel supply and distribution system with partners. The fuel industry is currently working to address surplus supplies as a result of the travel restrictions and stay-at-home orders in response to COVID 19. • Every year on May 1, the fuel industry transitions from winter grade gasoline to summer grade stocks. On March 27, EPA issued a Reid Vapor Pressure (RVP) waiver, allowing companies to continue using the existing surplus supply of winter blend fuels remaining in the system after May 1. Oregon has more stringent requirements. ODOE is working with the Oregon Department of Agriculture and DEQ to ensure all state conditions for an RVP waiver are addressed.

 ESF 16 Law Enforcement	Stable	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Oregon Department of Corrections has had their first positive case of COVID-19 confirmed. It was a staff member who last worked on 3/19/20 and has been at home since that time. Precautions have been taken to quarantine 222 adults in custody and today they were all examined by a physician with no one exhibiting signs. There will be follow up. Staff members potentially exposed have been contacted and none are showing signs of exposure at this time.
 ESF 17 Agriculture and Animal Protection	Stable	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Developing and distributing guidance for food retailers and food processors related to the Governor's Executive Order and how to maintain proper social distancing in grocery stores. • ODA has also been working with farmer's markets and livestock auctions to provide guidance on implementation of the Governor's executive orders
 ESF 18 Business and Industry	Stable	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Continuing to have discussions with public and private partners in regards to PPE production by Oregon companies. Currently working on vetting firms and providing that list to the governor's office. • Small Business Development Centers (SBDC) are working with over 415 firms who have suffered direct impact from COVID 19.
