

This chart shows the number of Oregonians who have tested positive for COVID-19 and whether they were ever hospitalized for their illness.



Oregon has more stringent requirements. ODOE is working with the Oregon Department of Agriculture and DEQ to ensure all state conditions for a RVP waiver are addressed
